# How to make a movie on your phone

Your film doesn't need to be professional. Simply pick up your mobile phone and get creative!

Keep it real: Focus on an idea or innovation that matters to you

Keep it simple: Focus on a single character with a clear message

Keep it short: 2-3 minutes (5 mins won't be considered)

### Filming tips



Shoot in landscape only (not portrait)



Keep the sound clear (stay out of the wind)



Keep the camera steady (prevents blur)



Combine different shots to create an interesting film



Use free editing apps YouCut (Android) or iMovie (iOS)
