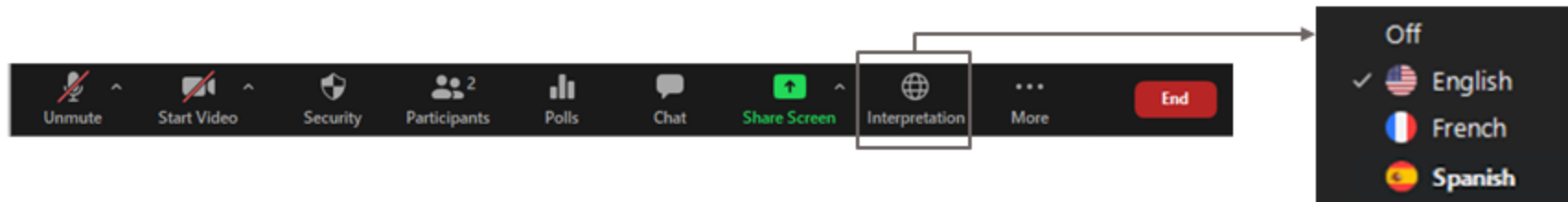

Case Study 1: Initial entry to working partnership with COVID-19



- District entry through technical subcommittees
- Demand driven – district C19 response and preparedness plan
- Mapping and tracking of supporting partners and resource gaps
- Joint activity planning
- Implementation through district government with Titukulane resources
- Facilitating vertical coordination including alignment with national plan

Case Study 2: Working with local governments to respond to pandemics



1. **Joint planning**
participate in the development of national and district C19 preparedness and response plans
2. **Letting the local government lead**
better access to participants, greater mobility
3. **Flexibility in allocating resources to address evolving needs**
timing , channels and content

Nawiri Case Study

Nawiri's Goal: Sustainably reduce persistent acute malnutrition in Samburu and Turkana counties

Timeline Oct 2019 – Sept 2024 (5 Years)

What did we experience?

What did we learn?

Nawiri: Government Engagement

Engagement of county government and other key actors were on:

1. Developing Nawiri's research and learning activities and processes.
2. Covid-19 Response – Design & Learning Sprints.
 - Support adaptation of **information and communication systems** to the COVID-19 context to reduce risks of COVID-19 and accelerate SBC for lasting improvements in nutrition.

Experience:

- Coordination challenges including duplication of efforts due to many actors willing to support.
- COVID resulted to shift from physical (Govt-preferred) to Virtual Engagement which posed challenges.
 - Slow uptake of virtual platforms e.g. Zoom; Connectivity Challenges.
 - Support through Virtual Conference equipments.
- Govt receptive to ideas and made the necessary adaptations especially in responding to the pandemic.
 - Periodic Learning Sprints during implementation.

Nawiri: Key Lessons

- Coordination support is key for interventions to be effective and also to ensure efficient use of resources.
- Despite its rigid systems, Govt has the willingness to learn where there is *evidence* adapt accordingly.
