How improved rehabilitation practices increase biodiversity in Niger - step by step

STEP 1

Sensitization and engagement of local elected officials on the pastoral land rehabilitation activities. Through this meeting, local elected officials proposed sites to be targeted, which were then jointly visited.



STEP 2

Development of a joint workplan with partners, government officials and local actors around the land rehabilitation approach.



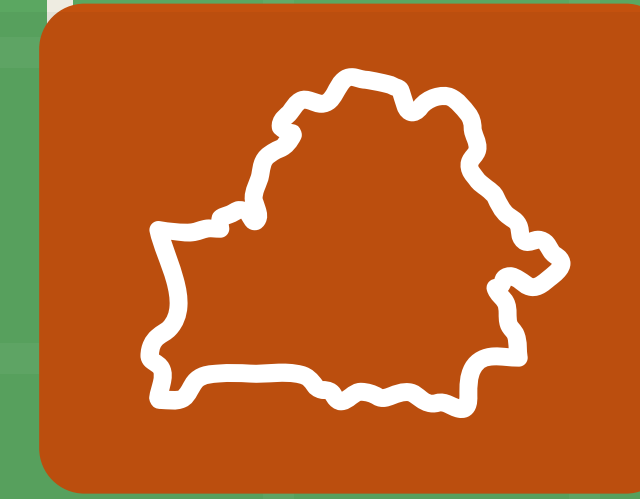
STEP 3

Preparation of resources to assist in decision-making, such as guidance for carrying out a consultative process comprising government and partners to develop flexible, integrated, multi-annual and multi-sectoral operational plans, and maps of the watershed and micro-watershed at the commune level used to identify target watersheds for restoration activities.



STEP 4

Definition of pastoral site (grazing area) boundaries through an official Order in an effort to prevent conflict between herders and farmers.



STEP 5

Targeting and organization of local support teams, with each targeted household contributing one member to participate in the Food for Asset activity.



STEP 6

Distribution of tools to each group of participants for the construction of pastoral half-moons and planting of seed grasses and forest trees, supervised by local government environmental services. Set-up of a site Management Committee (33% women, 33% youth) to ensure compliance with site management and operation rules and guard it from grazing animals.
