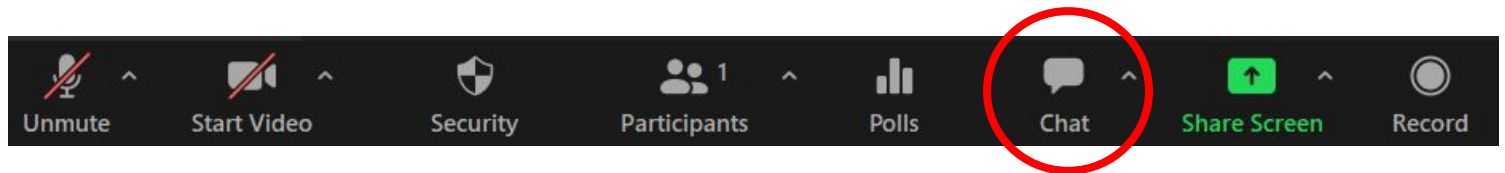

What are we saying - definitions?

Multi-donor funding: a program or project that is implemented using resources from more than one donor.

HDP Nexus: “A term used to capture the interlinkages between the humanitarian, development and peace sectors. It specifically refers to attempts in these fields to work together to more effectively meet people's needs, mitigate risks and vulnerabilities, and move toward sustainable peace” - UN

Resilience - a few definitions:

- “The capacity of people and systems to advance and protect long-term well-being, despite shocks and stresses.” - *Mercy Corps*
- “Resilience is the ability to bounce back from and recover from shocks and stresses in a manner that reduces chronic vulnerability and facilitates inclusive growth.” - *CRS*
- “Resilience-building aims to enhance the ability of vulnerable people to absorb, adapt and transform in the face of shocks and stressors.” - *WFP*

Context & Programmatic Overview

Context: endemic war and conflict, extreme seasonality, climatic shocks, no infrastructure, governance vacuum, increasing emergency humanitarian need

Projects: USAID/BHA-funded *Resilience Food Security Program* and European Union-funded *Building a Culture of Social Cohesion and Peace*

Sectors: resilience, livelihoods, WASH, youth engagement, trauma awareness and social cohesion, nutrition, conflict early warning and access to justice

Modalities: BHA food for assets and EU cash for work

Programming focus: Pivot between resilience, social cohesion, humanitarian emergency and recovery

Reach: USAID/BHA: 689,206 program participants, EU: 164,820 program participants

Location: Greater Jonglei, South Sudan
Teams operating from 10+ locations
