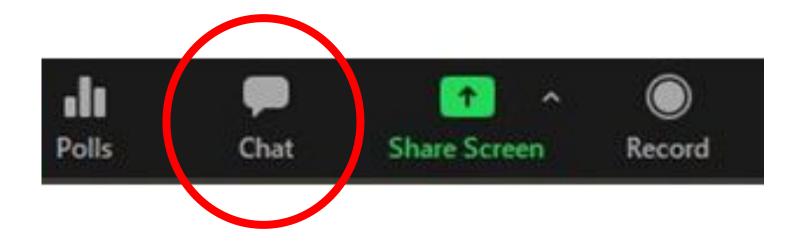

Esomchi Foundation is an NGO addressing malnutrition and hidden hunger by promoting nutrient-enriched crops such as Orange Fleshed Sweet Potato (OFSP), Provitamin A Cassava, Provitamin A Maize through innovative, affordable, safe and nutrition food products for all age groups. With sponsorship from the African Development Bank (AfDB) funded TAAT OFSP Compact Program, Esomchi Foundation partnered with the International Potato Centre (CIP) to train 18 value addition specialists from the six (6) geo-political zones in Nigeria on OFSP value addition. The training was held at Esomchi Foods factory, Nnewi, Anambra State, Nigeria. During this period, the processors were taught how to make diverse innovative food products from OFSP. These include: OFSP bread, OFSP juice, OFSP chin chin, OFSP burger, OFSP shawarma, OFSP African salad, OFSP meat pie, OFSP doughnut, OFSP stew, OFSP flour etc. These food products are receiving overwhelming acceptability in the Nigerian market while struggling to meet the growing demands due to limited capacities. Our approach is helping to significantly scale the reach of OFSP and its food products towards improving household nutrition and income of smallholder farmers sustainably.

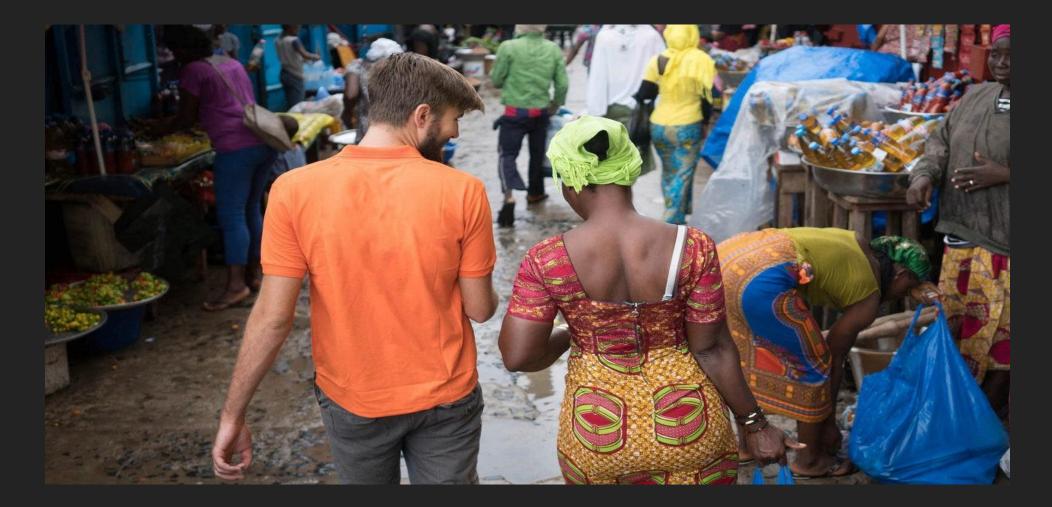
