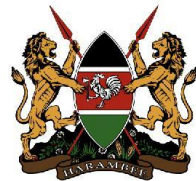

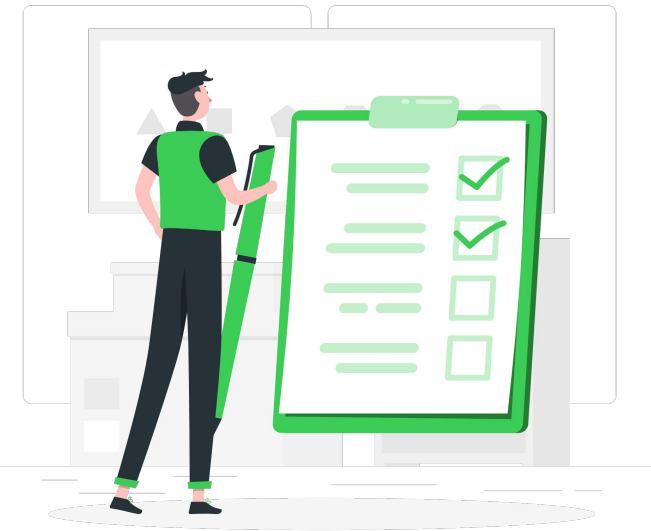
Why the “P” in HDP



Integrating the “P” in HDP Programming

Key process considerations

- Conflict assessment informs design
- Design articulates expected Peacebuilding change - strategic objectives (SOs) / Intermediate Results (IRs)
- Theory of Change shows Peacebuilding coherence with other sectors
- MEAL framework includes Peacebuilding elements
- Baseline, midline, and endline include Peacebuilding elements
- Ongoing monitoring of how all HDP interventions interact with context to avoid doing harm



Key Considerations for Peacebuilding MEAL



- Both qualitative and quantitative indicators
- Disaggregation of indicators across lines of division / conflict
- Context indicators facilitate monitoring of shifts in context
- Adaptive management
- Innovative MEAL practice
 - Mini social cohesion barometer
 - Social cohesion indicator bank
 - Outcome harvesting
 - Experimental treatment & control groups
