#### WORKSHOP PURPOSE

To bring together USAID staff, development food security activity (DFSA) implementing partners, and RISE II partners to jointly review the implications of Year 1 findings on activity design and implementation plans, and agree on the way forward.

#### **WORKSHOP OBJECTIVES**

- Review the learnings from formative research, pilot studies, community consultations, government engagement, and other key Year 1 efforts.
- Refine the activity design and implementation approaches based on the learnings from various studies, the insights provided by stakeholder analysis and consultations, including collaboration with key RISE II and other non-FFP stakeholders.
- Identify remaining knowledge gaps and develop initial plans for continued learning, knowledge sharing, and activity adaptation beyond the refinement year.
- Address any outstanding PREP questions.

# EXPECTED DELIVERIES & OUTPUTS

- Collaborative USAID-IP workshop proceedings form the basis for revised Theory of Change (TOC) and implementation plan submissions.
- It is the IP's responsibility to transform workshop proceedings into fully revised TOC and implementation plan deliverables.
