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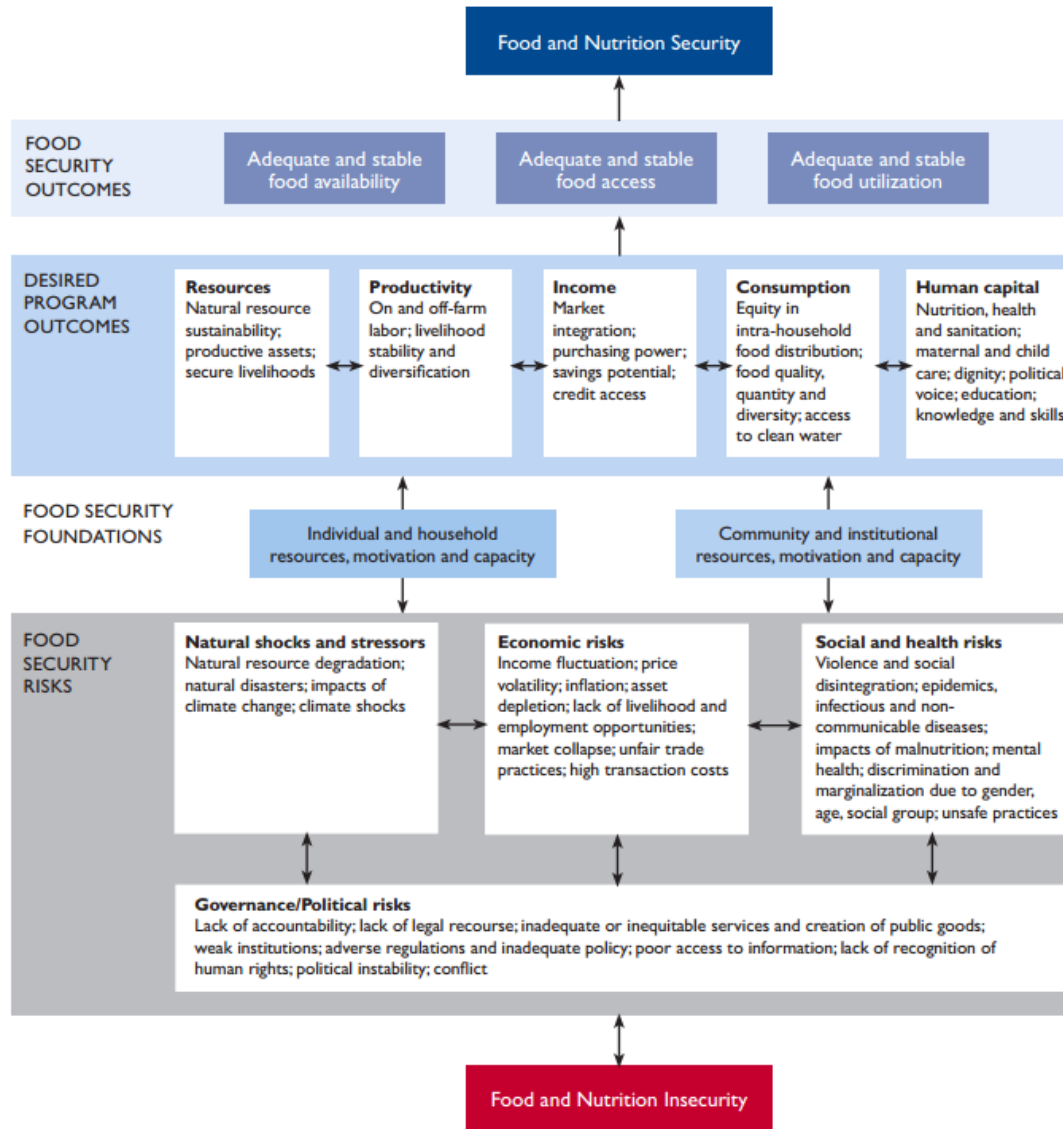
# FFP Food Security Definition

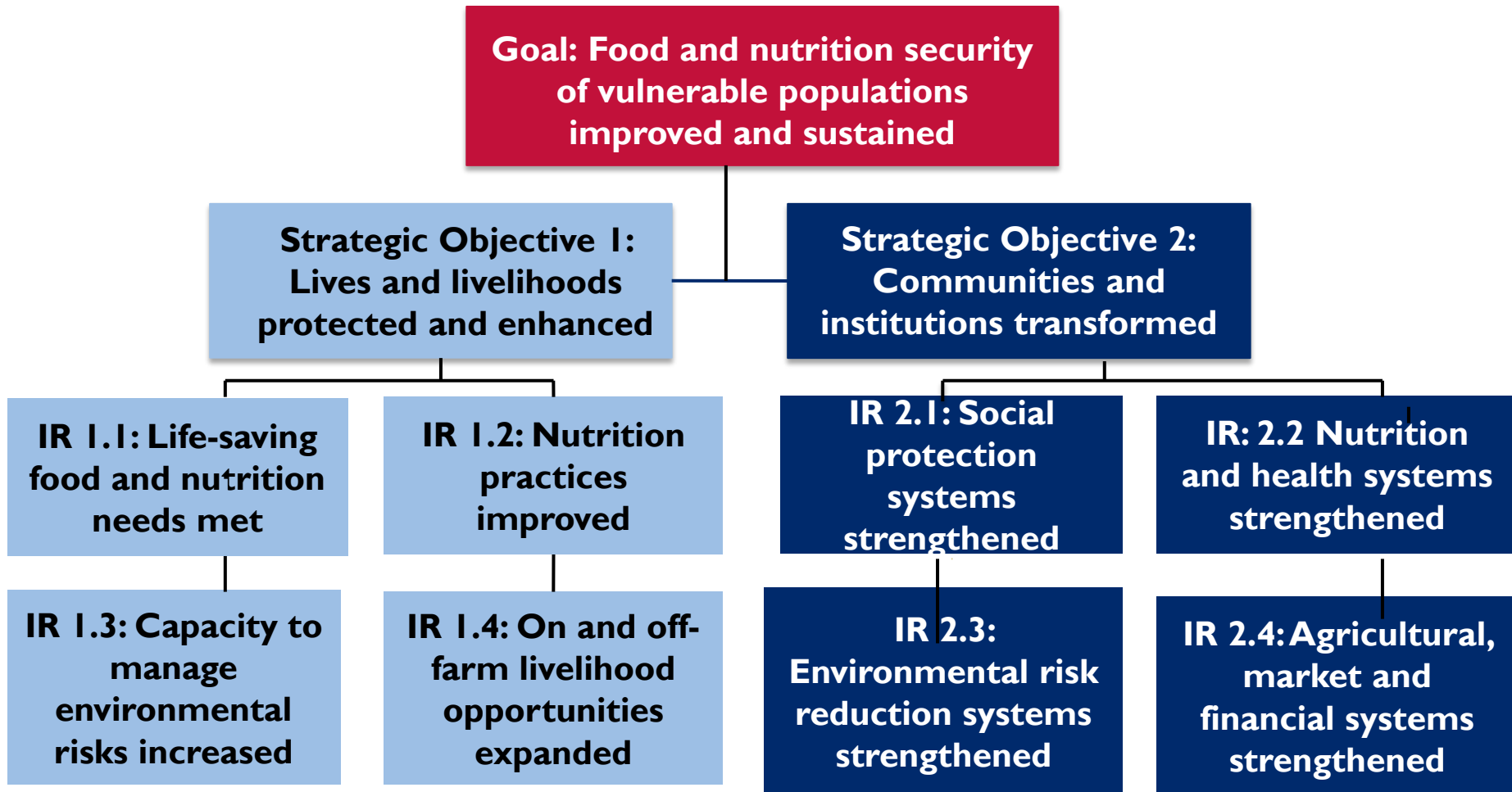
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# FFP Food Security Conceptual Framework
