USAID's Resilience Strategy

Earlier this month USAID released their first policy and program guidance on building resilience. They define resilience as the "ability of people, households, communities, countries, and systems to mitigate, adapt to and recover from shocks and stresses in a manner that reduces chronic vulnerability and facilitates inclusive growth." The guidance specifically focuses on areas where chronic poverty intersects with shocks and stresses to produce recurrent crises and undermine development gains. It emphasizes approaches that empower women and more effectively reduce gaps between males and females. Click here to read the guidance document. Impacts: Effectiveness of Title II Program Exit Strategies, February 7, 2013

On February 7, 2013, the Food and Nutrition Technical Assistance III Project (FANTA) will host a day-long stakeholder meeting for Tufts University to present the results of a multi-year study to investigate the factors that predict program sustainability after exit. Four countries participated in the study: Bolivia, Honduras, India, and Kenya. The programs were assessed at the time of exit through two years after program shut down, using both qualitative methods and quantitative survey data. For more information, click here. 

Featured Information Resource: Social and Behavior Change for Family Planning: How to Develop Behavior Change Strategies for Integrating Family Planning into Maternal and Child Health Programs

This tool, developed by CORE Group, is designed for use of local staff to run a two-and-a-half day training course that teaches the basics of "designing for behavior change." It serves as a starting point for addressing family planning by building skills and helping staff get started in social and behavior change. The concepts and tools can also be applied to other topics including maternal and child health, nutrition, infectious disease care and control, sanitation, and more.
