The workshop "Enhancing Resilience in the Horn of Africa: An Evidence-based Summit on Strategies for Success" was held December 13 and 14, 2011. The workshop, facilitated by the International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI) and TOPS, brought together more than 180 participants from the donor, implementer and academic communities to promote the sharing of lessons and research on building resilience to adverse shocks.

Speakers Announced for Workshop on Nutrition Assessment, Counseling and Support (NACS) in the Context of HIV, February 22-23, 2012

Registration is open for the TOPS and CORE Group technical meeting, Getting the Knack of NACS, to advance the state of the art on NACS in the context of HIV and beyond.

Speakers will include:

- Alice Tang, Associate Professor, Nutrition/Infection Unit, Tufts University School of Medicine, who will summarize the current evidence about the nutrition implications of HIV and of ART, and the effect of malnutrition on HIV outcomes.
- Mark Manary, Washington University Professor of Pediatrics and Founder of Project Peanut Butter (Malawi), who will present the evidence base for supplementary and therapeutic feeding for people living with HIV.
- Margaret Kyenkya, COP of the recently concluded NuLife Project, who will be sharing the NuLife continuum of care and the approach that they established to assure quality in that work.
- Ram Shrestha, Senior Quality Improvement Advisor, Community Health and Nutrition of URC, who will share experience, process and tools used to assure quality in Kenya.


