#### Webinar and Online Discussion: The Cost of Not Treating Depression in Food Security Programs: A New Frontier in Global Mental Health

TOPS and the FSN Network will be holding a webinar and online discussion on the treatment of depression in a food security context on Tuesday, June 25, from 1-2:30 PM EDT. Lena Verdeli, Columbia University, will discuss the findings of a study examining the efficacy of group interpersonal psychotherapy in treating depression. From a recent meta-analysis, we now know that eliminating maternal depression could result in a 23-29% reduction in child stunting. The presentation will shed light on how food security professionals can better respond to the issue of depression and help close the treatment gap in places that have few mental health workers.


