Details on the FY14 RFA Guidance: FFP Consultation Process: Submit Input by June 24

TOPS has been asked by Food for Peace (FFP) to facilitate a consultation to solicit feedback to improve future Development Food Assistance Programs (DFAP) Request for Applications (RFA) and country guidance. This rapid process over the next three weeks led by Tim Ogborn, tim.ogborn@gmail.com, will consist of initial discussions internally within PVOs with the output submitted by June 24. That output will form the basis for discussions at a half-day workshop on June 27th, 9 AM - 1 PM. Representatives from FFP will be in attendance. This is an opportunity for the PVO community to have an impact on the DFAP RFA, and so improve the ability to design and implement effective food security programs with FFP.
