Presentations on FANTA/Tufts Exit Strategies Study Available

Presentations from the stakeholder meeting on results of the USAID/FFP-supported FANTA/Tufts Exit Strategies Study are now available <u>online</u>. These show the preliminary findings of a multi-year study of the factors that predict program sustainability after exit. Four countries participated in the study: Bolivia, Honduras, India, and Kenya. The programs were assessed from the time of exit through two years after program shut-down, using both qualitative methods and quantitative survey data. The final report will be released later this year.



- The USAID/DFID Humanitarian Innovation Initiative has been released as a new window of funding under the existing USAID Office of Development Innovation Ventures APS. The Humanitarian Innovation Window will support programs up to \$1 million that bring to scale cost-effective breakthrough innovations to humanitarian challenges. For more information, click here. - FANTA is seeking agriculture and livelihoods consultants to develop a country-specific Food Security Country Framework (FSCF) for Malawi and Burma to guide Title II Awardees in upcoming proposal submissions for the Development Food Aid Program Awards in 2014. The consultant will participate in the framework development process, identifying and reviewing background documents, conducting consultations with key stakeholders both internationally and in-country, and be the lead writer of the final document.
