Measuring Resilience for Food Security: TOPS April 2 Stakeholder Consultation

Resilience has recently emerged as a framework for improving regional and local capacity to deal with shocks. Recognized in new <u>USAID policy and program guidance</u>, resilience approaches are seen as a potential means to reduce the scope and scale of humanitarian responses. Tim Frankenberger, president of TANGO International, will discuss the recent expert consultation on measuring resilience held by the Food and Agriculture Organization and World Food Programme in Rome.

TOPS is hosting this stakeholder consultation for all interested parties to learn more about progress in defining and operationalizing resilience measurement strategies. The session will be participatory, providing the implementing community the opportunity to contribute to the resilience conversation, policies, and practices, based on field experience, needs, and realities.



This guide, developed by FHI 360 and World Vision, provides the field-level practitioner with tools and applications to reach very poor households. The intended outcome of the resource is to have greater market engagement for those households through enterprise development activities.

The guide focuses on reaching the very poor, defined as those persons in the bottom half of the population below the nationally defined poverty line or those living on less than the purchasing power parity
