# Updated: FY 2014 Request for Applications for Title II Development Food Assistance Programs

USAID has released an amended Fiscal Year 2014 (FY 2014) Request for Applications (RFA) for Title II Development Food Assistance Programs in Burundi, Madagascar and Malawi. The country-specific information for Burundi and Madagascar has also been amended. The country specific information for Malawi remains unchanged.

These revisions have been made to reflect recent changes to FFP authorities as outlined in the Agricultural Act of 2014. The FY2014 Development Food Assistance Applications are due on Thursday, April 3rd by 11:59 AM EDT.



This guide explains how mHealth serves newborn health through referral and tracking of mothers and infants, decision support for CHWs, CHW supervision, scheduling and tracking postpartum and postnatal visits, and teaching and counseling for mothers and families.
